


### How to use our hands-on facilities (Experience Programs)

Details regarding the experience programs including the schedule of availablility of our hands-on facilities are posted on the website. Please check the details on the different programs in advance and gather in front of each venue by the time indicated. Participants will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis until the maximum number of people per facility has been reached. Groups of ten or more people will be given a tour of the various facilities after an introductory briefing.

In order to create a community-wide local disaster preparedness framework, the program will provide simulated experiences at our hands-on facilities for members of disaster management associations and other organizations to enhance their knowledge of disaster prevention and confirm the importance of preparedness in the event of a disaster.



It performed rescue operations, collected information on disaster sites, and was used as a firefighting helicopter for 17 years until 2005, when it was replaced by the new "Hiei-go" helicopter
